Welcome to Cheadle (Staffs) u3a and we re pleased to welcome you as a member to our enthusiastic and friendly u3a. You are joining over 700 local members who are keen to learn, laugh, live, sharing knowledge and making friendships.

Interest groups.

This is our heart, with over 50 groups covering a huge range of interests and activities. All our groups are listed on the website and in the latest print version of the programme. Our main base is at The Guild Hall but groups use a number of local venues in Cheadle town and further a field.

How to join a group. Each group has a Leader who facilitates the sessions. To join get in touch with the Leader via the website, by the telephone number on the programme or by contacting the Groups Coordinator. There are spaces available but some groups operate a waiting list to ensure fair access. When a place is confirmed it is just a matter of turning up and paying the £2 session fee. All other costs are incidental and may include a refreshments fund or materials costs, all will become clear.

Monthly Coffee mornings. Everyone is welcome at the Coffee mornings held at The Guild Hall on the second Wednesday of the month, from 10 till 12 and £2 entrance fee. Meet other members, socialise and keep in touch with the Committee.

Social Activities. We organise our own events and also take part in local events.

Membership Fees. Membership runs from 1st January to 31st December each calendar year. Our membership fees are kept at a modest amount to cover the annual levy to the national Third Age Trust, publicity, printing, and the basic costs to maintain the organisation in Cheadle. Our accounts are independently examined annually and reported to the Charity Commission.

If you are a tax payer, we can reclaim Gift Aid which then contributes to our funds. Please make sure we have a record if you are happy for us to claim on your behalf. If there are changes in circumstances please let the membership secretary know.

How you can Help. We value the experience, knowledge and energy you bring when you join Cheadle u3a. We are all volunteers and the emphasis is on sharing and lifelong learning, laughing, having fun and making friends on the way.
